

CONSOLIDATION OF MENTOR PROTÉGÉ PROGRAMS

FACILITY SECURITY CLEARANCES NOT REQUIRED FOR JV IF BOTH PARTNERS HAVE A SUCH CLEARANCE



MENTORS CANNOT SUBMIT COMPETING OFFERS



PROTÉGÉS FROM PUERTO RICO MAY HAVE UP TO FIVE MPAs



MPP CONSOLIDATION CONTINUED...

JV MAY RECEIVE UNLIMITED CONTRACTS IN TWO-YEAR PERIOD – NO MORE 3-IN-2 RULE



- NO JV APPROVAL FROM SBA, INCLUDING COMPETITIVE 8(A) JV
- **PROTÉGÉ MAY SUBSTITUTE** MENTORS



The Application Process





Maintaining Eligibility



PROTEGES MUST:

Submit annual reports

Demonstrate material or developmental benefits

MENTORS MUST:

Provide meaningful assistance, as described in agreement

Submit annual and project-end reports & Certificates of Compliance

SBA RESERVES THE RIGHT TO:

Terminate the agreement for noncompliance if the mentor hasn't provided proper assistance

Renew the agreement for an additional three years upon expiration after the initial three years

JOINT VENTURES

JOINT VENTURE BASICS

- MPA approval required prior to JV bid on award
- MPP does not review or approve JVs
- SBA District Offices approve JVs for 8(a) sole source only
- MPA JVs are granted exclusions from affiliation
- MPA JVs may earn unlimited contracts in two years
- Procuring activities must consider past performance individually by each partner to the joint venture as well as any work done by the joint venture itself.
- Protégé firms must perform at least 40%, Mentor firms may perform up to 60%

JV Small-N-BigBiz receive a \$10M services contract. A similarly situated entity performs \$2M of the work. The JV must perform of the work. Protégé, SmallBiz must therefore perform of the work.



REFERNCE - 13 CFR 125.8(e)

When evaluating the capabilities, past performance, experience, business systems and certifications of an entity submitting an offer for a contract set aside or reserved for small business as a joint venture established pursuant to this section, a procuring activity must consider work done and qualifications held individually by each partner to the joint venture as well as any work done by the joint venture itself

previously. A procuring activity may not require the protégé firm to individually meet the same evaluation or responsibility criteria as that required of other offerors generally. The partners to the joint venture in the aggregate must demonstrate the past performance, experience, business systems and certifications necessary to perform the contract.

SUMMARY

The proposed rule would provide new methods for small business government contractors to obtain past performance ratings to be used with offers on prime contracts with the Federal Government. A small business contractor may use a past performance rating for work performed as a member of a joint venture or for work performed as a first-tier subcontractor. This proposed rule updates the requirements for small business subcontracting plans to add a requirement for prime contractors to report past performance to a first-tier, small business subcontractor when requested by the small business that was a first-tier subcontractor.


